




Anandaram Dhekial Phookan College (ADP College) celebrated its Golden Jubilee of its existence in 2009. Since its inception the college has been promoting Higher Education and other activities related to life skill development of the young aspirants from middle Assam. Development of poor and needy students of this region always remains the primary objective of the college. IQAC

The Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) of ADP College was set up in 2005. The first cycle of NAAC accreditation was held in 2004, when the college was awarded B grade. In the second cycle, the college was reaccredited by NAAC with A grade with CGPA 3.11. In the 3rd cycle the college was re-accredited with B⁺⁺ Grade with CGPA 2.94. INFRASTRUCTURE

In an effort to bring up the existing infrastructure into higher level of growth, construction of buildings are in progress. All the existing science laboratories are equipped with new editions of sophisticated instruments. Mention may be made of instruments like Research Microscope with camera, Leminas flow and Spectro Photometre for the Department of Botany. A Bio-Tech Hub with modern equipments has been newly constructed for Advance Research work in the field of Science.

The college has digital smart classroom facilities in all Science subjects, equipped with facilities like LCD Projector, Kiosk Board, Audio & Video gadget, Computer Hub etc. It has opened a language laboratory in the first floor of Golden Jubilee commemorative building. There are altogether 12 nos. of digital classrooms.

The Institution has set up a 20 KVA Eco friendly silent generator and a 50KVA Solar Power Plant for uninterrupted power supply.

All departments and Central library have computers with wifi connectivity. It too has an Amenities Centre where Xerox, Internet, Lamination, DTP, spiral binding etc. facilities at reasonable rates are available. The college has a Canteen. ATM(SBI) is installed inside the college campus. The college has its own website (www.adpcollege.ac.in). The college has a well preserved Orchid House.



There are two water coolers and a good number of water purifiers for supplying pure drinking water to students. There are two multistoried hostels for girl students, one indoor stadium, one auditorium, seminar halls, computer hub, a water distillation plant and a gymnasium. College has a botanical garden and a vermicompost plant. Construction of multistoried building is completed with financial assistance from Govt. of Assam. A new multistoried building has been completed under the infrastructure grant provided by RUSA. The building consists of a modern spacious girls' common room and a good number of classrooms.

The indoor stadium with a modern gymnasium has fulfilled the long standing demand for a state of the art sports complex in the college premises. This facility inspires the students as well as the teachers of the college to engage in various sports and physical activities.

Apart from this a spacious guest room, two departments namely Dept. of Commerce and Post-Graduate Dept. of History have been alloted on the 1st floor of Indoor sports complex.

The present existing library has been enlarged for establising a sophisticated digital library and user friendly reference library. Chemistry departmental laboratory has been further modernised with recently constructed physical and general laboratory.

FACILITY CENTRE

There is a facility centre in the college with sufficient number of computers equipped with Broadband connectivity for internet browsing. Students can avail internet facility at nominal fee. Other facilities like Photocopy, Lamination, DTP, Spiral binding etc. are also available at the centre.

LIBRARY

The ADP College Central Library has altogether 51,527 books which include text books, reference books and books of general interest. Apart from these, library has special collections on Gandhian Philosophy, Fashion Designing, Competitive Exminations, Web designing, Bio-Informatics, Ambedkar and Vivekananda studies and Career guidance.

The Library remains open on all working days from 10A.M. to 4P.M. The reading room on the first floor of the library building is equipped with 26 Magazines and Journals, 10 nos. of national and regional news papers and a good number of reference books offering much more facilities for the students. Membership of the library is open to teachers, students, non teaching staff of the college, research scholars and guest members. The central library has a modern digital library where members can avail internet facility against nominal charge. There is a reference section where reference books and rare books are made available, however no one can borrow books from these sections and can have photocopies. The Library has also been equiped with a Manuscript section in 2020.

A student is provided with a card with the facility to borrow two books at a time for 15 days. A student having Major subject gets the privilege of borrowing 4 books at a time. Students are to follow library rules. A sum of `1 per day will be charged for each book, if not returned within due date. They must return the library card at the end of the session. Apart from these the library provides different types of services to its users. They are lending service, reference service, photocopying service and Internet service etc. In the area of Library Automations the college library installed SOUL Software in 2006. Students can use Online Public Access Catalogue (OPAC) for searching their desired books and journals. Circulation of books are done through SOUL Software.

M. A. IN ASSAMESE

DURATION: 2 YEARS INTAKE CAPACITY- 30

- 1. a) The Master of Arts (M.A.) Programme (previously called 'Course') in Assamese under Gauhati University will be covered in 4 (four) Semesters:
 - The 1st and the 3rd Semesters will be from July to December.
 - The 2nd and the 4th Semesters will be from January to June.
 - b) Every Semester will have approximately 100 working days (after leaving out Sundays, vacations and Holidays) and 250 working hours (taking into account class-cancellations and half holidays).
 - c) Each Course and internal assessment will get 60 academic hours at the minimum.
- 2. a) The total marks for the Programme will be 1600 of which 80% (=1280) will be external and 20% (=320) will be internal.
 - b) Each Semester will have 5 'Courses' (previously called 'Papers'). Each Course will be of 80 marks. 80% (=64) of the total marks for the Course will be external and 20% (=16) of the total marks for the Course will be internal. This means, each question paper in an examination will be of 64 marks. The remaining 16 marks will be calculated internally. However, the internal assessment for each Course will be related to the content of the Course.
 - c) All Courses except 3-04, 3-05, 4-02, 4-03, 4-04 and 4-05 are common for all students. Courses 3-04, 3-05, 4-02, 4-03, 4-04 and 4-05 are optional. Students will have to study either 3-04A, 3-05A, 4-02A, 4-03A, 4-04A and 4-05A or 3-04B, 3-05B, 4-02B, 4-03B, 4-04B and 4-05B. Those who study the first group mentioned above will be considered as having 'Specialization in Assamese Literature' (or 'Specialization in Group-A'). In the same way, the students who study the second group mentioned above will be considered as having 'Specialization in Assamese Language' (or 'Specialization in group-B')
 - d) Each Course in the present syllabus indicates only the external marks (i.e., 64 marks, referred to as 'Full Marks' as far as the external examination is concerned).
 - e) Credit Point for each Course will be 8 (eight).
 - f) The Internal Assessment marks for

each Course will be calculated as shown below-

i) Sessional Examination : 8 marks ii) Seminar (s) : 4 marks iii) Home Assignments (s) : 4 marks

- III) Girls' Hostel: The college offers hostel facilities for Girl students. There are two Girls' hostels in the college campus. Preference is given to meritorious and poor students and students who come from distant places while giving admission.

Hostel forms can be obtained on the day of admission into First Semester. The date of hostel admission will be notified after selection.



- **IV)** Student's Insurance: The College has already introduced a novel way to insure every student of the institution under the Student Insurance Scheme managed by New India Assurance Co. against any untoward incident at a nominal annual premium of Rs. 20/- (rupees twenty) only.
- V) Career Counselling Cell: The college runs a career counselling cell and the students can avail guidance from it on their career prospects. The cell organizes career guidance workshops.
- VI) Health care and pure drinking water facility: College provides free health check-up for all students. Aqua-guards are installed at various points to supply drinking water.
- VII) Canteen: The College Canteen provides light refreshments to students and college staff under hygienic conditions at affordable prices.
- VIII) Security System: The whole college campus is monitored through Close Circuit Camera.
- **IX)** Incentives to Student: There is provision to give text books free of cost to needy students. Students with poor performance will be helped to attain the necessary level of proficiency through remedial coaching. The college felicitates star performers who secure 9 or above CGPA in Degree Course final examination.
- X) Sale Counter: There is sale counter for Vermicompost and Mushroom, which are produced in the college.







UGC Scholarship : (A) For general category- APL / BPL certificate has to be produced.

(B) For OBC/ MOBC (non creamy layer)/ SC/ ST category.

Minority Scholarship: (A) Annual income certificate from the DDO's for the students whose

father / mother is in service. (B) Annual income certificate from the Circle officer / Mouzadar for the students whose father / mother is not in service.

General Scholarship: Students may claim National Scholarship, State Merit Scholarship, ST/SC/

OBC/Minority Scholarship according to their choice and eligibility subject to Govt. rule 3 of 7. Provision is there for cash award for students who are

differently able.

Ishan Uday: The Ishan Uday Scheme sponsored by the UGC (University Grants Commission)

has been availed by our first year undergraduate students from the academic year 2015-16. The students whose family income does not exceed Rs. 4.5 lakh

per annum, are eligible to apply for this scholarship.

XI) Students Aid Fund: On application, the needy students get aid in terms of cash or books from this Fund subject to fund position, provided the authority is satisfied with his/her conduct and overall performance in all aspects. There is a fund contributed by teachers to help students in their need.

XII) NCC & NSS: The NCC is an organization which provides a golden opportunity to the students to develop leadership qualities, spirit of service and self confidence. It helps them to be disciplined and build a dynamic personality to further the cause of National Integration. Students can opt for Advance course on First Aid. At the end of the prescribed course an examination is held and certificates are issued to the successful cadets. The National Service Scheme (NSS) is an organisation providing opportunity for students to develop their personality through community service. Students of our college have earned name and fame from these.

XIII) Associations: The ADP College Students' Union is the General Body of the students of the college. Its membership is compulsory for every student. The election to the college students union is held strictly in conformity with Lyngdoh Commission Recommendations. The Prof.-in-charge/advisors for different portfolios are appointed by the Principal.

Apart from it, the college has a number of associations and forums namely ADP College Science, Society, ADP College Geographical Society, ADP College Study Circle, Cine Club, Eco club etc. The Principal of the college is the President of all these Associations.

XIV) Alumni Association: There is an Alumni Association in the college. The association takes active part in the all round development of the college. A sum of Rs. 200.00 is collected from every student at the time of leaving this institution after passing final examination as contribution to Alumni Association Fund.

XV) Placement Cell: There is a Placement Cell in the college, which guides students for job interviews by the Companies, Banks etc. for recruitment. The cell also arranges coaching/preparatory classes for different competitive examinations.





XVI) Seminar / Work shop / Lecture Programmes etc.: The college organises an annual lecture programme in memory of Anandaram Dhekial Phookan which is delivered by a person of eminence. It also organises various seminars and workshops sponsored by UGC and other agencies.

XVII) College Publication: The college publishes books written/ edited by its staff members. It also publishes journals, departmental bulletins etc.

XVIII) Anandaram Dhekial Phookan Award: An annual award was instituted in the name of Ananadaram Dhekial Phookan in 2017. The award is given every year to someone having original contribution and leaving impact on the lives of people of Assam. Science & Technology, environment, sports etc. are some of the areas where would be given. Name of the receipient of this Award till date are: Dr. Bidyut Kr. Sharma (2017), Srii Nahendra Padon (2018), Smt. Birubala Rabha (2019), Sri Bishnu Khargharia (2020), Sri Yeshe Dorjee Thongchi (2022), Sri Biren Singha (2023).

Initiative of RUSA:

Rashtriya Uchchatar Shiksha Abhiyan (RUSA) is a Centrally Sponsored Scheme (CSS), launched in 2013 aims at providing strategic funding to eligible state higher educational institutions. The central funding (in the ratio of 60:40) for general category state, 90:10 for special category states and 100% for union territories) would be norm based and outcome dependent. The funding would flow from the central ministry through the state governments/ union territories to the State Higher Education Councils before reaching the identified institutions. Since 2016-17, ADP College is funded by RUSA under different schemes. The college has received a financial grant of Rs 1 crore of which a new RCC building consisting of six spacious rooms of Rs 70 lacs has been completed. The Girls' common room in the building has been facilitated with privacy of sanitation. The remaining amount has been utilised on construction of linking roads in the college, purchasing of lab equipments and sports facilities. In addition to the infrastructure grant of RUSA towards ADP college, the college has had a grant of Rs. 2.5 lacs on Equity Initiatives. Under Equity Initiatives College has run a scheme known as Finishing School which aims to develop wholeness of inherent personality of students. Skill development is one of the prime aim of the course targeting all round development of final year students. The course will enhance personality development as well as communication skill while facing an interview for a job. As per the discussion with parent body of Finishing School, skilled youths will have ample opportunities to be engaged in corporate as well as multi-national agencies and for that youths have been trained to fit in that atmosphere. ADP college takes immense pride in shouldering such noble responsibility in guiding our youths for uplifting to get brightest future. The program has been started in regular manner targeting third year students from 2018 onwards. A well equipped room for finishing school has been allotted on the first floor of RUSA building.

Rules and Regulations

General Rules

The college lays great emphasis on discipline and character building of the students. So they must abide by the rules and regulations of the college and the hostel.

- College uniform is compulsory for every working day. Students without uniform will not be allowed
 to enter the college campus.
- 2. Students can not bring four wheelers inside the campus. Two wheeler must have silencers.







- 3. Smoking, spitting, throwing waste indecently, destroying college property, making noise and loitering in the campus may lead pecuniary fine or expulsion from the college or both.
- 4. All forms of ragging in the college or in the Hostel are strictly prohibited. Strong disciplinary action will be take against those involved in such activities.
 - 5. The Identity Card should be brought to the college every day and is to be produced whenever asked for.

Library Rules

- 1. A student is provided a library card with the facility to borrow two books at a time for 15 days. A student having Major subject gets the privilege of borrowing 4 books at a time. Students are to follow library rules. They must return the library card at the end of the session.
- 2. In no case a student can keep a book for more than 15 days from the date of issue. The books may be reissued for another 15 days as per rule of the library.
- 3. If He/She does not return the book within 15 days a fine of Rs.1 per day up to 15 days and Rs. 1 (one) per day thereafter will be imposed.

Hostel Rules

- 1. All hostel boarders are required to maintain hostel rules strictly. A copy of 'Hostel Rules' will be provided to each boarder at the time of Hostel Admission.
- Indulging in ragging, damaging hostel property or violating hostel rules is liable to be expelled from the hostel as well as from the college.
- 3. Hostel remains closed during summer and puja vacations.
- Hostel boarders are required to keep their rooms tidy, neat and clean and observe proper methods of disposal of garbage.
- 5. Outstation leave will be granted only on production of an application by the boarder duly signed by the parents or local guardian.

Election Rules

- The election of ADP College students' union is held as per guidelines of Hon'ble Supreme Court of India dated 22-09-2006. The guidelines are as follows—
- i. Under graduate students between the ages of 17 and 22, only can contest the election.
- ii. The candidates should in no event have any academic arrears in the year of contesting the election.
- iii. The candidate should have the minimum percentage of attendance in classes as prescribed by the university of 75% attendance, whichever is higher.
- iv. The candidate shall not have a previous criminal record. The candidate shall also not have been subject to any disciplinary action by the College Authority.
- v. The candidate must be a regular full time student of the college.





CODE OF CONDUCT FOR STUDENTS:

- I. Students are expected to maintain the highest standards of discipline and dignified manner of behavior inside as well as outside the College campus. They shall abide by the rules and regulations of the College and should act in a way that highlights the discipline and esteem of the College.
- 2. A six day working schedule from Monday to Saturday is followed. Classes are scheduled from 9.00 a.m.
- 3. All the students are expected to be present in the class well -within time.
- 4. No student shall enter or leave the class room when the session is on without the permission of the teacher concerned.
- 5. In the events of Student seminars/project presentations etc., it is compulsory that all the students of the concerned class be present for the entire session.
- 6. All students shall leave the college premises after the classes are over. No students shall wander or gather in verandah, corridor, and staircase etc.
- 7. All leave applications (Regular & Medical) shall be submitted in time, for sanction by HoD. Application for medical leave shall be accompanied by valid medical certificates.
- 8. Students shall come to the college only in approved uniforms.
- 9. Students shall not make any alterations to the college uniform. Any violation of this could result in suspension from the college.
- 10. All the students are expected to attend all college functions in college uniform unless otherwise specified.
- 11. All the students shall wear their identity cards, well displayed. Identity badge is a public document and any teaching staff and non teaching staff shall have the right to peruse it.
- 12. Students shall not bring powered high decibel sounding vehicles inside the campus. Speed limit of 10 KM will be maintained inside the campus.
- 13. Students are expected to maintain silence in the academic buildings to maintain the decorum and, any deviant behavior such as hooting, whistling, loitering etc. will be treated as indiscipline.
- 14. For independent study, students are expected to use the class rooms, library or the demarcated areas of the academic building and shall not resort to sitting in staircases or circulation areas where they could interfere with the free movement.
- 15. Students are encouraged to make use of the library, common computing facilities and to involve in professional body activities or any program authorized by the college beyond class hours. However under normal circumstances students shall retreat to their hostels or residences by 5.00PM.
- 16. Accessing Social Networking Sites is prohibited within the classroom; however access to these sites are permitted in hostel building during time slots specified by the hostel wardens. Cellphones can be used in classroom for academic purpose with permission.
- 17. Students must keep the campus neat and clean. Do not put any waste anywhere in the campus except in the waste baskets kept. Any violation of this shall invite disciplinary action.







- 18. Consumption of intoxicants / psychotropic substances in any form or smoking or using chewinggum, gutka, panmasala etc. are strictly prohibited.
- 19. It is strongly advised to refrain from activities such as scribbling or noting on walls, door or furniture which could deface the college and destroy the academic ambiance.
- 20. Carefully handle the furniture, equipment, fixtures and appliances of the college and lab. Careless handling/misuse of the above could result personal injuries or damage to property Follow safety precautions near electrical installations. In the event of damage of property, the responsible students will have to bear the cost of replacement/repair with fine.
- 21. Students are not permitted to arrange any unauthorized celebrations and decorations of any magnitude in the campus.
- 22. Students are not permitted to distribute or display (both physically and electronically) material such as notices, banners, X'mas stars etc. in the campus without the permission of the competent authority.
- 23. Students are expected to make use of academic, co-curricular and extracurricular facilities available to the optimum levels. This will certainly make them physically fit, academically competent, mentally alert and socially sensitive.
- 24. Students who intend to represent the college in intercollegiate events shall take prior permission from the concerned head of the department and the selection will be based on parameters such as academic performance, attendance, character, existing academic pressure and competence of the student in the proposed event for participation.
- 25. During internal examinations of 1 hr period, students are not allowed to leave the hall within half an hour from the beginning of the exam, and students have to occupy the seat 5 minutes before the commencement of the examination.
- 26. The College Union will be formed as per Lyngdoh Commission recommendations approved by the Honorable Supreme Court of India. It will be based on a parliamentary (indirect) system given in Section No.6.2.4 of Lyngdoh Commission recommendations.
- 27. Political activity in any form is not permitted in the College campus. Unauthorized meetings, propaganda work, processions or fund collections are forbidden within the College, hostels, and outside the college.
- 28. Harassing juniors, ill treatment to other fellow students or any such form of ragging is objectionable and liable to be treated as criminal offence by the law enforcing agencies as per the directives of Hon'ble Supreme Court of India.
- 29. Misbehavior towards girl students, use of threat or violence against members of the staff or fellow students will be considered as very serious cases of misconduct.
- 30. Students must pay fees, mess bills etc. in time as per rule.
- 31. Any violation of the above rules will invite penalty in the form of warning, fine, inviting guardians or any course of corrective measure as found suitable by the concerned staff member or higher authority of the College.
- 32. Expulsion from the College is enough for expulsion from the hostel.



Discipline

- Maximum emphasis is laid on discipline and character building, and students are expected to maintain a high standard of discipline. They are subject to rules and regulations of the college.
- 2. Violation of rules, indecent activity, indiscipline, unsatisfactory progress, irregular attendance, irregular clearance of college dues, showing discourtesy to teachers and office staff in any form etc. are some of the offences which may make students liable for disciplinary action like termination of scholarship, forced transfer and even expulsion from the college.
- 3. Students' Union and all other Associations functioning in the college shall be subject to such guidance and control as the college administration may prescribe from time to time.
- 4. Any notice desired to be pasted or circulated by the students anywhere on the college premises shall require the permission of the Principal. Nothing can be done on the college campus without the knowledge of and permission from the college authority.
- All powers for maintenance of discipline are vested with the Principal and his decision shall be final in all such matters.
- 6. Ragging of any sort is strictly prohibited. The college has its anti-ragging committee and anti-ragging squad. The victims of ragging are requested to contact with the Principal or any of the members of faculty. Contact numbers are displayed in the College premises.
- 7. Use of cellphones is not allowed in the class room and restricted areas indicated.
- 8. Students are advised not to give public post in any social media on any matter related to the college. Violation of which shall be treated as punishable offence. Parents/ Guardians are also expected to maintain decency in such matters.

Grievance Redressal Cell: The Grievance Redressal Cell of the College aims at creating an atmosphere of self-discipline and accountability among the students. Any body connected with the College can submit specific allegations, grievances, suggestions in the box kept for this purpose in front of the office of the Principal. The Principal in consultation with the members of the cell, takes necessary action in respect of the complaints, suggestions and grievances etc.

Women Cell: A women cell is functioning in the college to safeguard the interest of fair sex and their welfare measures.

Uniform: Students without uniform will not be allowed to enter in the campus.

Boys: Light Sky Blue Shirt and Black Pant.

Girls: Muga or muga-coloured mekhela, skyblue blouse and white chadar/

white saree with skyblue border. (For PG Students)

White salwar-kameez and sky blue chunni.

Borkha, Short Kurties & Leggings (Girls'), Kurta & Pyjamas (Boys) are not allowed. Face can not be covered by students.

College Teaching Staff: The college has a highly qualified teaching staff. 41 teachers have Ph.D. Several teachers are pursuing research works under MRP scheme of UGC. A few teachers are doing research work leading to Ph. D. degree. All the teachers have to undergo mandatory training under Refresher/ Orientation course/ short term course to keep abreast of recent developments in their respective subjects. Several Major Research Project and Minor Research Projects are going on.
